












Dr. Joseph H. Hagan, Fourteenth President of Assumption College, delivered these farewell remarks to an audience at Taylor Dining Hall, as recorded in the February 5, 1998 issue of *Le Provocateur*, by their staff.

"Assumption College community:

...In thanking the many people who have made these past twenty years so meaningful for myself and the College, I must pay a very special tribute to my wife Pat. She has been by my side through thick and thin, in good times and bad, and she has been my greatest source of inspiration and strength. I love her more than words can say. Her contribution, not only to my life, but also to the life of this college, has been enormous. All of us owe her a great debt of gratitude.

I am grateful to our trustees, not only for their consideration and generosity in regard to my retirement, but also for their guidance and support during the entire period of my presidency. We have a fine Board, and all of us can be thankful that it continues to play such an important role here at Assumption.



I also wish to thank the Assumptionists for their help and encouragement over the years. They are a fine group of priests and brothers, and their presence here is of enormous value. I have said often that we have the finest faculty of any small college in the country, and I am happy to repeat it now. Your concern for students and your dedication to the College are exemplary, and I thank you most sincerely.

My senior administrators and the other administrators have been faithful partners with me in the management of Assumption. I owe you a great debt for all you have done for me and for the school. We also have a wonderful staff, and I want to pay tribute to you for all your efforts which make possible the smooth operation of our day-to-day activities here.

Because we are all human and fallible, I wish to beg pardon and forgiveness of anyone I may have hurt or offended during my time here. I never deliberately or consciously set out to make life difficult for any of you, but if I have, please forgive me for it. For my part, I forgive totally any offenses against me. I leave with no bitterness or resentment but with gratitude and appreciation.

The record of what has been accomplished here since 1978 speaks for itself. It is unnecessary to specifically recount those successes here this afternoon. In brief, we have been faithful to the mission of this College as a Catholic institution of higher learning; we have stabilized and strengthened our financial position; we have increased our endowment from around \$750,000 to approximately \$30 million; we have raised millions of dollars in capital and annual funds; we have improved and sustained the morale of all those associated with the College; we have significantly increased salaries and benefits; we have increased applications and enrollment, having welcomed the largest freshman class in the College's history; we have built many new buildings and greatly improved our physical facilities; and most significantly, have strengthened our academic programs in a way that has been nationally recognized.

For Assumption College, I trust that the best is yet to come. A firm foundation has been laid for continued progress. It will be the task of new leadership to bring Assumption into the next millennium and to a place of prominence among our nation's great colleges and universities. Can it be done? Of course it can be done. I believe it with all my heart. You have only to seize the opportunity. I have done the very best I could. I have run the course and finished the race, but the challenge for Assumption remains. My thoughts and prayers will be with you always.





The Phoenix






The 1997 Assumption College Golf team featured experienced veteran and talented new comers. The team, led by senior captain

Resnet, a new dorm, new pipes, new year...(aug.27.1997)

A new residence hall, which has yet to be officially named, is under construction behind Wachusett Hall and is set to be completed by the summer of 1998. The new hall is a housing option for all sophomores, juniors, and seniors upon completion.

The concept behind the new hall, which was created by Vice-President for Student Life, J. Richard Christiansen, has been centered upon the idea of a living /learning environment. The goal of this atmosphere will be to "allow students with a particular, generally academic in nature, to join with other students in pursuing those interests outside of the classroom.

Being allowed residency in the dorm would be a reward to students who are seeking a broader academic experience, while at the same time, "working toward changing the climate of the whole residential community."

The five floor building will house 160 students divided into groups of four students per apartment. The appartments are planned to be designed with full amenities; kitchen, living room, bathroom, and two bedrooms (three bedrooms for resident assistants).The apartments will also be fully equiped with air conditioning, and the entire facility will be handicapped accessible.

Another major development on campus has been the implementation of the Resnet program. Thanks to Greater Media Cable, Comlink/Wiltel and the AC Computer Services Dept., students can now enjoy the benefits of cable television and internet access from the comfort of their rooms.

Assumption Celebrates 25 Years of Coeducation

Vice President for Academic Affairs, Lisa Moulten, said that Plough "Wasn't afraid to give his point-of-view. He told it like it was, he told the truth."

"Dr. Plough was not the kind of candidate who told us what we wanted to hear," said SGA President Carl Cafaro, the only student on the Presidential Search Committee.

Faith and self-esteem are the two most important things Plough believes he can give a student.

We anticipate his arrival and the beginning of a new legacy at Assumption College.

The A.C. Allies Club has provided a hot topic for discussion across


