Recipients of Honorary Doctorates

Aaron T. Beck, M.D.

Dr. Aaron T. Beck is director of the Center for Cognitive Therapy at the University of Pennsylvania. He established an international reputation as "the Father of Cognitive Therapy" by pioneering the formulation of cognitive models of various psychiatric disorders, and developing and testing specific psychotherapeutic applications to the disorders.

Dr. Beck's research has received awards from the American Psychiatric Association, American Psychological Association, and the American Psychopathological Association. He received the Albert Einstein Award from the Albert Einstein School of Medicine, the Louis Dublin Award from the

Association of Suicidology, the Annual Research Award from the American Suicide Foundation, and the Westwood Lodge Award.

He is author of nine books, including Depression: Causes and Treatment, Cognitive Therapy and the Emotional Disorders, and Love is Never Enough.

He has been the honoree of the Stone Lectureship at Harvard University and the Thomas Salmon Lectureship of the New York Academy of Medicine. He received an honorary Doctorate of Medical Science from Brown University, where he serves as a member of the Corporation Committee on Medical Education. He received the highest honor accorded to a faculty member at the University of Pennsylvania: University Professor. He also received a MERIT award from the National Institute of Mental Health for his investigations of suicide.

He is currently engaged in systematic outcome studies of the cognitive therapy of cocaine abuse, avoidant personality disorder, compulsive personality disorder,

chronic depression, and rapid cycling bipolar affective disorder.

The various inventories and questionnaires developed by Beck are widely used in research and clinical practice. The Beck Depression Inventory, Beck Hopelessness Scale, and Beck Suicide Ideation Scale, three of his scales, are among the most widely used.

His research in psychopathology has identified specific risk factors for suicide and specific psychological configurations in depression, anxiety disorders, and per-

A recent study by the Institute of Scientific Information indicated that Beck's published research articles between 1986 and 1991 are among the six most frequently cited in psychological literature. He has been named among the top seven psychotherapists in a survey published in the American Psychologist and among the top three psychotherapists in a survey published in the Canadian Psychologist.

In addition to its scientific merit, Dr. Beck's work in cognitive therapy has helped to refocus psychology's attention on the problems of freedom, choice and

responsibility.

Angela G. Dorenkamp, Ph.D.

Dr. Dorenkamp is a Professor of English at Assumption College and is retiring after teaching for more than twenty years.

A beloved educator, Dr. Dorenkamp is a co-editor of the text Images of Women in American Popular Culture. She received her bachelor's degree summa cum laude from Webster College, MO, her master's degree from St. Louis University, MO, and her doctoral degree from the University of Connecticut. Her honors include membership in Kappa Gamma Pi, Phi Beta Kappa, being a Radcliffe Institute Fellow, a Danforth Associate, and a Worcester Woman of Achievement 1984. In 1990, she was awarded the Sears Foundation Award for Excellence in Teaching. She received the YWCA's Katharine F. Erskine Award in the Arts, Humanities and Education category this year.

Dr. Dorenkamp has published numerous articles and presented a variety of papers on English, rhetoric, and women's concerns. She did editorial work on four

books.

Civic involvement is another priority for Dr. Dorenkamp. She was a member of the Worcester Public Schools Committee on Education Goals, the Worcester Public Schools Committee on Chap. 622, and the state's Regional Committee on the same issue. She was a vice president of Prospect House and a member of its Board of Directors. She was also vice president of Citizens' Plan E Association and a member of its board. She was a member of the City Manager's Advisory Committee on the Status of Women, the Governor's Commission on the Status of Women, and the Planning Committee for This Is Worcester.

Dr. Dorenkamp was on the Advisory Board at Quinsigamond Community College and became a member of the Board of Trustees for the College. She was also a member of the Board of Trustees for Worcester Vocational Schools and was president of the board. She is a member of the Board of Directors for University

Health Systems of New England Inc. and the Board of Trustees for the Worcester Public Library.

Dr. Dorenkamp has four grown children; Erica Ann, John Henry, Thomas More and Monica Clare.

Iames H. Harrington

James H. Harrington is founder of Dolphin Resource Group, Inc., and currently serves as chairman and CEO of this consulting firm that serves New England's nonprofit and small business community. A native of Worcester, Mr. Harrington earned his bachelor's degree from Hobart College in 1962.

He was an industrial relations specialist for General Telephone and Electronics until he started his own real estate development firm, Moreland Estates Inc. He turned to the field of human services where he was responsible for the development and operation of Big Brother/Big Sister agencies in Worcester, Keene, NH, and Portland, ME. He was also a trustee and consultant for the agency.

In 1980, he became the CEO of the New England Science Center where he was responsible for total restructuring, which led to a nearly 300 percent growth in

its market. In 1991, Gov. William Weld appointed Mr. Harrington as public education policy advisor. His recommendations to the Governor resulted in the consolidation of the university sector, new approaches to public sector funding, and various other reforms.

He is a gubernatorial appointee to the Massachusetts Higher Education Nominating Council and a trustee of the Alliance for Education. He is also a trustee of the Worcester Foundation for Experimental Biology, WICN public radio, the Greater Worcester Community Foundation, and Associated Grantmakers of Massachusetts.

He is also a trustee of Dynamy, Inc., Mechanics Hall, the American Antiquarian Society, Worcester Art Museum, Worcester Natural History Society, Higgins Armory, Clark University, and Quinsigamond Community College Foundation.

Mr. Harrington resides in Worcester and Osterville with his wife Phyllis and two daughters.

Elizabeth S. Reidy

Elizabeth S. Reidy is a past co-director of the Pernet Family Health Agency, a social agency, under the sponsonorship of the Little Sisters of the Assumption. She is retired and remains active as a volunteer and Board member of the agency.

Ms. Reidy received her bachelor's degree from Emmanuel College in 1950 and her master's degree in social work from Boston College School of Social Work in 1952. She is a member of the Emmanuel College Alumni Association.

She did advanced studies at Boston University Graduate School in supervision, staff training and consultation. She is licensed for Independent Clinical Social Work and is a Board Certified Diplomate in Clinical Social Work.

While with Pernet, she was Program and Personnel Consultant and Group Facilitator for Parent Education Support Groups.

She has also been the social worker for families at the Nazareth Home for Boys in Leicester, directed parent training workshops with St. Agnes Guild, and worked in adoption studies for Catholic Charities.

She was a medical social worker for the Veterans' Administration Hospital in Rutland, and a social worker with the Family Service Organizations.

She is a member of the National Association of Social Workers. In addition to Pernet, she is a board member for the Housing Information Center of Worcester and is a member of the Parent Aide Association for New England. She is a member of the Little Sisters of the Assumption Provincial Council and is the first lay person to be named to the Little Sisters of the Assumption Formation Team.

George S. Elias, director of the Institute for Social and Rehabilitation Services at Assumption College, has said of Ms. Reidy, "She is one of the few who has been successful in enabling the disadvantaged to achieve a level of dignity and enhanced self-esteem, allowing them to then participate more fully in our society. The work she has done to assist families achieve a level of stability demonstrated a faith that at times could have moved mountains."

She and her husband, Francis P. Reidy, have seven children and six grandchildren.

Most Reverend Daniel P. Reilly, D.D.

His Excellency, Daniel Patrick Reilly, D.D., Bishop of Worcester, was ordained to the priesthood on May 30, 1953. He was appointed associate pastor to the Cathedral of SS Peter & Paul, Providence, RI, in June of 1953, and assistant Chancellor of the Diocese of Providence in September, 1954. He was named Secretary to the Bishop in 1956 and Chancellor of the Diocese in 1964.

He attended Our Lady of Providence Seminary, RI, the Grand Seminaire in St. Brieuc, France, and Boston College School of Management. He furthered his studies at Harvard University Graduate School of Business Administration.

Bishop Reilly attended two sessions of the Second Vatican Council in 1962 and 1964, and was named a Monsignor by the Holy Father in 1965. He was Administrator of the Diocese of Providence from August of 1971 to January of 1972, and Vicar General from April of 1972 to 1975.

He was ordained and installed Bishop of the Diocese of Norwich, CT, in August of 1975 at the Cathedral of St. Patrick, Norwich.

He served as Chairman of Catholic Relief Services, the agency of the U.S. Catholic Bishops for overseas aid and development, from 1978 to 1986, and was a member of the Finance and Budget Committee for the U.S. Catholic Conference from 1985 to 1987.

He holds honorary doctoral degrees from Providence College, Salve Regina College, Our Lady of Providence College Seminary, Sacred Heart University, St. Michael's College, and Holy Apostles College & Seminary.

Bishop Reilly serves on many committees and boards concerned with international economic development and aid. He was a member of the drafting committee of the U.S. Catholic Conference for the Pastoral Letter on "The Challenge of Peace" and was chairman of the 10th Anniversary Committee on "The Challenge of Peace."

He was a member of the Pontifical Council - Cor Unum from 1984 -1989 and was Consultor for the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace in 1994.

He was a member of many civic and religious organizations in Connecticut and was chaplain to the State Police of that state, as well as a member of the Law Enforcement Council of Eastern Connecticut.

He was installed as fourth Bishop of Worcester on December 8,1994.




Medallion of the President of Assumption College

The shield on the seal is divided into four sections by the Cross, symbol of Christ, denoting the College as a Catholic Institution. It is a "fleurdelisée" Cross, a reminder that the College is located in the Diocese of Worcester, which also has this style Cross on its coat of arms. On the Cross is an open book, representing the Gospel, which is the foundation of teaching at a Catholic institution, and also representing the Liberal Arts, which seek to lead the student to knowledge and wisdom. On the book are the letters ART (Adveniat Regnum Tuum or Thy Kingdom Come) a phrase from the Lord's Prayer which is the motto of the Assumptionists who founded the College in 1904. In the upper left quarter is the monogram of Mary with a crown above it, a symbol of the Blessed Virgin Mary in her Assumption. In the lower right quarter is the fleur-de-lis, a reminder of the French origins of the founding religious order.

The Medallion is suspended by a chain the links of which consist of the letter "M" with a crown representing the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Our Lady of the Assumption, patroness of the College.

This presidential medallion was designed, created, and given as a gift to Assumption College by John Cavanagh of Greenville, Rhode Island.

The Assumption College Mace



At Assumption College, education promotes self-discovery; but the true discovery of self must first take into account one's nature and purpose. The symbolism of the mace reflects the simple but essential elements that make for a full and responsible consideration of self, within the broader context in which there can be a full blossoming of the individual.

An education at Assumption nurtures the growth of specific habits or, more precisely, virtues. These include the Intellectual Virtues, which guide the student to Truth; the Moral Virtues (prudence, justice, fortitude, and moderation), which enable a person to lead a good life; and, most important of all, as Saint Paul and Saint Augustine would say, the Theological Virtues (faith, hope, and charity) which lead the Christian to ultimate happiness. The lettering in Latin on the three bands of the sterling node states simply the thrust of these essential Virtues: Intelligentia Adducitur Veritatem; Voluntas Adducitur Bonum; Cor Adducitur Amorem. The staff could be considered a "lignum vitae" (tree of life), from which the Virtues spring. The three upper branches of ebony and gold represent the Virtues and their impact upon everyone at the College, symbolized by the multifaceted fluorite stone.

At Assumption, it is the community's shared vision that fosters a full flowering of the individual. The three blossoms of gold from the blue fluorite represent the individual coming to full maturity in Christ, in accord with the College's motto "Until Christ be formed in you."

The Assumption College Mace was conceived, designed, created and given as a gift to Assumption College by Paul A. Cavanagh of Greenville, Rhode Island.




