

Father Richard John Neuhaus

Father Richard John Neuhaus is acclaimed as one of the foremost authorities on the role of religion in the contemporary world. He currently serves as President of the Institute on Religion and Public Life, a nonpartisan interreligious research and education institute in New York City. He is editor-in-chief of the Institute's journal, *First Things: A Journal of Religion, Culture, and Public Life* where he brings a thoughtful Catholic voice to many public debates. Fr. Neuhaus is also the author of a number of books, including *The Naked Public Square: Religion and Democracy in America, Freedom for Ministry* and *The Catholic Moment: The Paradox of the Church in the Postmodern World*.

As a Lutheran clergyman, Fr. Neuhaus served for 17 years as senior pastor of a low-income, African-American parish in Brooklyn, New York. He converted to Catholicism and was ordained a priest in 1991 in the Archdiocese of New York by the late Cardinal John O'Connor. Fr. Neuhaus has played a leadership role in organizations dealing with civil rights, international justice, and ecumenism. His work has been the subject of feature articles in popular and scholarly publications, both in the United States and abroad. He has been the recipient of numerous honors from universities and other institutions, including the John Paul II Award for Religious Freedom. He has held presidential appointments in the Carter, Reagan, and the first Bush administrations. In a 1988 survey of national leadership, *US News and World Report* named him one of the 32 "most influential intellectuals in America." In February 2005, *Time* magazine listed Fr. Neuhaus among the 25 most influential evangelicals in America.

Most recently, Fr. Neuhaus maintained an online diary during the recent papal elections in Rome, and provided live commentary from the Vatican on the Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN). Born in Canada, Fr. Neuhaus received his formal education both in Ontario and in the United States, and graduated from Concordia Theological Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri.

Michael Ritchie

From college student, to self-taught stage manager in New York, to Massachusetts Berkshires theatre festival producer, and now to Los Angeles as artistic director, Michael Ritchie continues to broaden his experience in American theatre. After attending Assumption College for two years in the mid-1970's, Ritchie moved to New York, where he stage-managed more than 50 productions on and off-Broadway, including shows at Circle in the Square, Lincoln Center and at the late Tony Randall's National Actors' Theatre. In 1996, he was named producer of the Williamstown Theatre Festival (WTF), one of America's leading summer theatres. During his tenure at WTF, he produced a diverse repertory of new plays, U.S. premieres, major revivals, and rediscoveries of American classics. The Festival also sent productions to Broadway, including *Hedda Gabler, One Mo' Time, The Price, The Rainmaker* and *The Man Who Had All the Luck*. The WTF was the recipient of the 2002 Regional Theatre Tony Award. During Ritchie's years at WTF, he also expanded the Greylock Project, a theatre program for inner-city youngsters in North Adams.

In January 2005, after nine years as WTF's producer, Ritchie assumed the role of artistic director of the Los Angeles-based Center Theatre Group, which includes the Mark Taper Forum and Ahmanson Theatre at the Los Angeles Music Center and the new Kirk Douglas Theatre in Culver City. Ritchie will open his first season at the Ahmanson in August with Sidney Kingsley's *Dead End*. In late September, Ritchie is presenting David Mamet's play, *Romance*, as the opener of the Taper's upcoming season.

Ritchie intends to continue his work with young people. According to a recent *Variety* interview, "Ritchie is attempting to change the more conservative approach by drawing young people from all sides – training them, courting them and presenting shows that push the envelope and appeal directly to their taste."

A native of Worcester, Ritchie is married to actress Kate Burton. He is a father of two.

The Valedictorian and Salutatorian are chosen from graduating students of the undergraduate day college, who fulfill the criteria for a Bachelor of Arts degree, *summa cum laude*. The selection committee consists of the Dean of Studies, Senior Class President and Vice President, Chairperson of the Commencement Committee and representatives of the Faculty. In evaluating candidates for these awards, the selection committee does not consider grades for any external coursework. The committee reviews academic records and contributions to the community, and interviews candidates in order to select the recipients of the College's highest graduation honors.

Medallion of the President of Assumption College



The shield on the seal is divided into four sections by the cross, symbol of Christ, denoting the College as a Catholic institution. It is a "fleur de lisée" cross, a reminder that the College is located in the Diocese of Worcester, which also has this style cross on its coat of arms. On the cross is an open book, representing the Gospel, which is the foundation of teaching at a Catholic institution, and also representing the Liberal Arts, which seek to lead the student to knowledge and wisdom. On the book are the letters ART (*Adveniat Regnum Tuum* or Thy Kingdom Come), a phrase from the Lord's Prayer which is the motto of the Assumptionists, who founded the College in 1904. In the upper left quarter is the monogram of Mary with a crown above it, a symbol of the Blessed Virgin Mary in her Assumption. In the lower right quarter is the fleur-de-lis, a reminder of the French origins of the founding religious order.

The Medallion is suspended by a chain, the links of which consist of the letter "M," with a crown representing the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Our Lady of the Assumption, patroness of the College.

This presidential medallion was designed, created, and given as a gift to Assumption College by John Cavanagh of Greenville, Rhode Island.

In medieval times, a mace was a spiked war club, an effective weapon in combat. Later, it became a symbol of authority, and in the context of an academic community, has come to signify teaching authority.

At Assumption College, education promotes self-discovery, but the true discovery of self must first take into account one's nature and purpose. The symbolism of the mace reflects the simple but essential elements that make for a full and responsible consideration of self, within the broader context in which there can be a full blossoming of the individual.

An education at Assumption nurtures the growth of specific habits or, more precisely, virtues. These include the Intellectual Virtues, which guide the student to truth; the Moral Virtues (prudence, justice, fortitude, and moderation), which enable a person to lead a good life; and, most important of all, as Saint Paul and Saint Augustine would say, the Theological Virtues (faith, hope, and charity), which lead the Christian to ultimate happiness. The lettering in Latin on the three bands of the sterling node states simply the thrust of these essential virtues: Intelligentia Adducitur Veritatem; Voluntas Adducitur Bonum; Cor Adducitur Amorem. The staff could be considered a "lignum vitae" (tree of life), from which the virtues spring. The three upper branches of ebony and gold represent the virtues and their impact upon everyone at the College, symbolized by the multifaceted fluorite stone.

At Assumption, it is the community's shared vision that fosters a full flowering of the individual. The three blossoms of gold from the blue fluorite represent the individual coming to full maturity in Christ, in accord with the College's motto: "Until Christ be formed in you."

Academic Regalia

The academic garb is derived from the 12th and 13th centuries, when most students and teachers were clerics and had taken at least minor holy orders. The assignment of colors to certain faculties was a much later development, and was standardized in the United States in the late 19th century. White was assigned to arts and letters; red, a traditional color of the church, was assigned to theology; green, for herbs, went to medicine; purple, the color of emperors, went to law; and golden yellow, standing for wealth and alchemy, went to the sciences. Because philosophy means love and pursuit of wisdom, in the case of the Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.), dark blue represents the mastery of the discipline of learning and scholarship in any field for which the degree is conferred, rather than in the discipline of philosophy alone.

Gowns vary by degree. The bachelor's gown has pointed sleeves. The master's gown has oblong sleeves, the rear of which are cut square and the front of which are cut in arcs. Both the bachelor's and master's gowns are untrimmed. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves and is faced down the front with black velvet. Three bars of velvet cross each sleeve. Often the bars are black, but they may also be in the color distinctive to the discipline in which the degree has been conferred.

In all cases, the exterior of the academic hood is black, and the interior is lined with the official color or colors of the institution that conferred the degree. The bachelor's hood is three feet in length; the master's is three and one-half feet; and the doctor's is four feet. Only the doctor's hood has panels at the sides. The edges of the hoods are velvet, and are two inches, three inches, and five inches for the bachelor's, master's, and doctor's degrees, respectively. The color of this trim is indicative of the subject to which the degree pertains.

The mortar board cap may be made of soft or hard material and, as its name suggests, symbolizes the role of learning in building an individual and shared future. The tassel is black or the color appropriate to the subject, with the exception of the doctor's tassel, which may be gold.

For all academic purposes, including trimmings of doctors' gowns, edging of hoods, and tassels of caps, the colors associated with different disciplines are as follows:
