Welcome Week

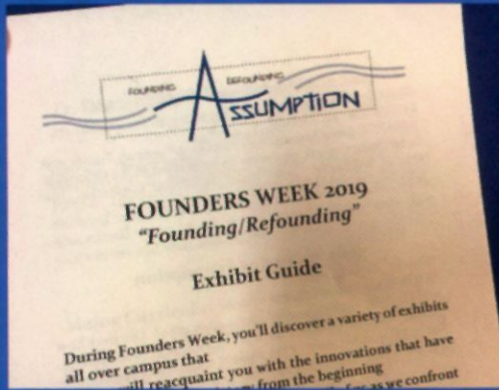
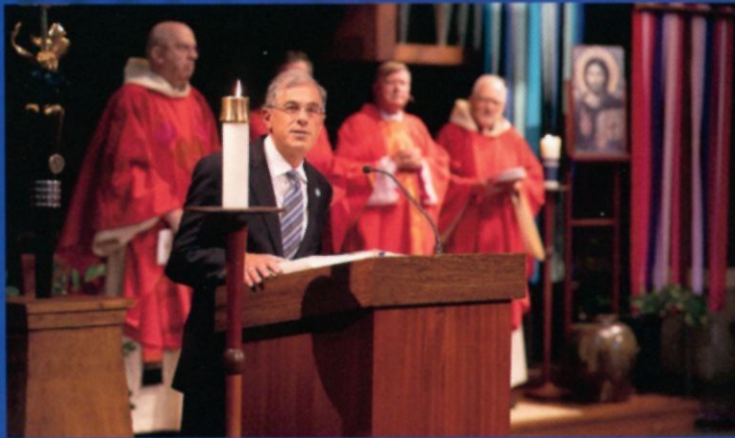

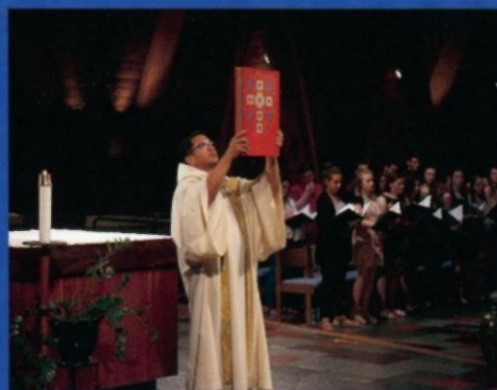
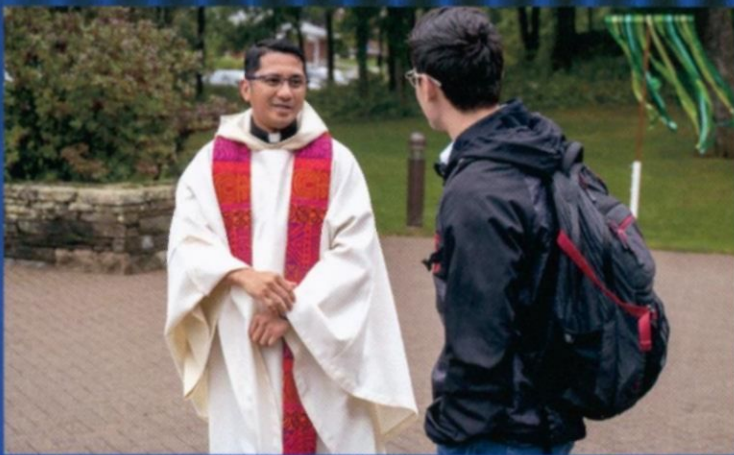




Founders Week

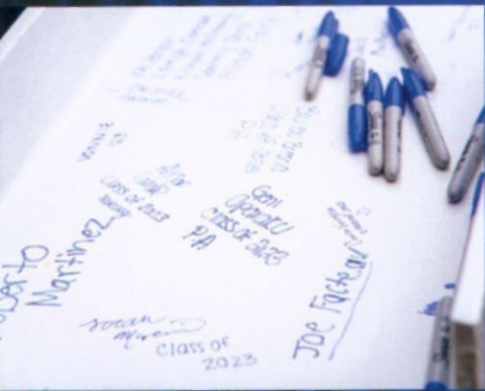




Beam Signing

Homecoming

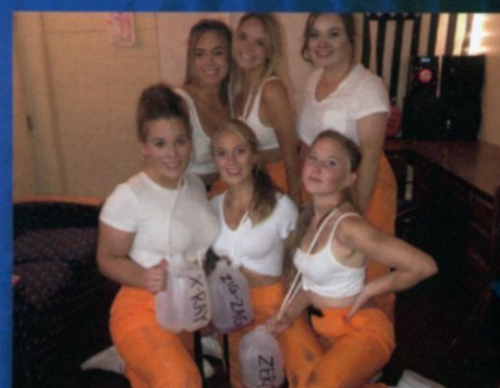
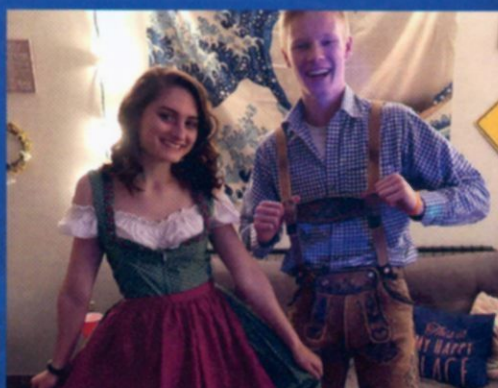

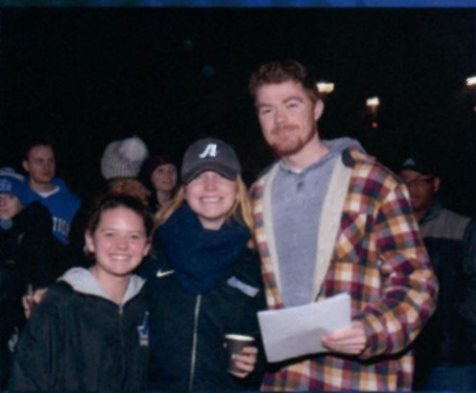




Xmas Tree Lighting

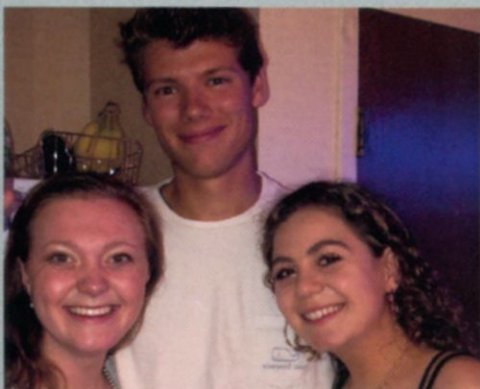

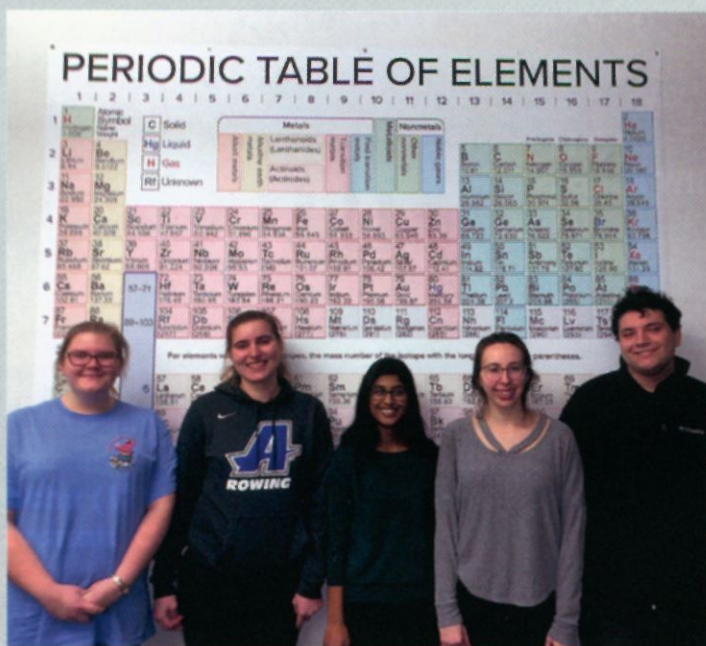

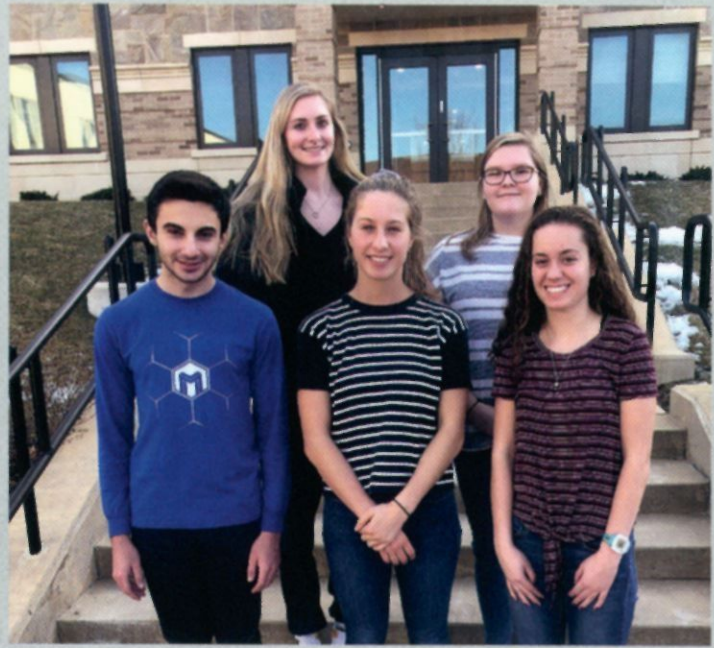

I congratulate you on all that you have accomplished and I challenge you to take what you have learned to lead a life beyond the self by contributing your time and talent in service to the community so as to create a better world for future generations.

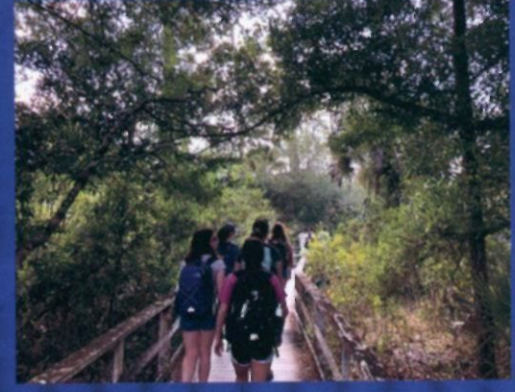
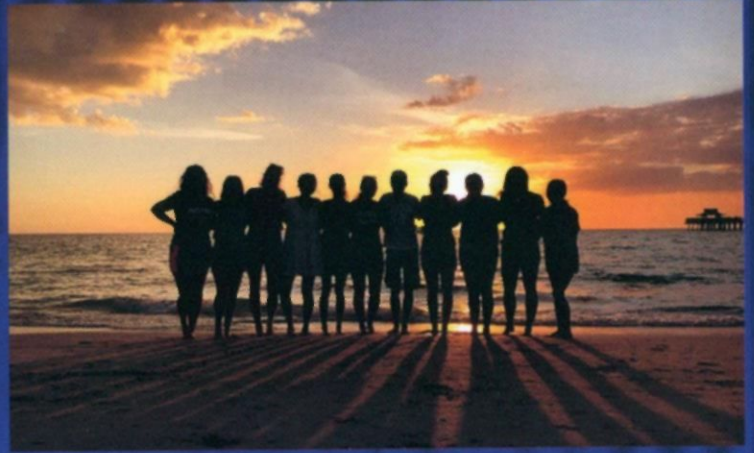


SEND Trips

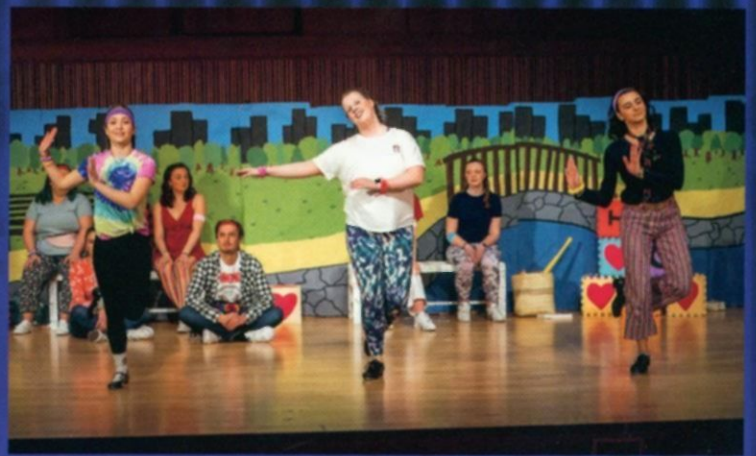

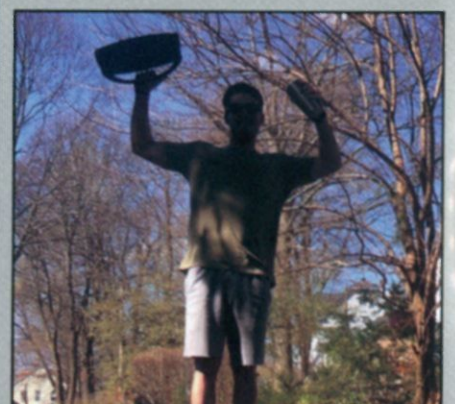


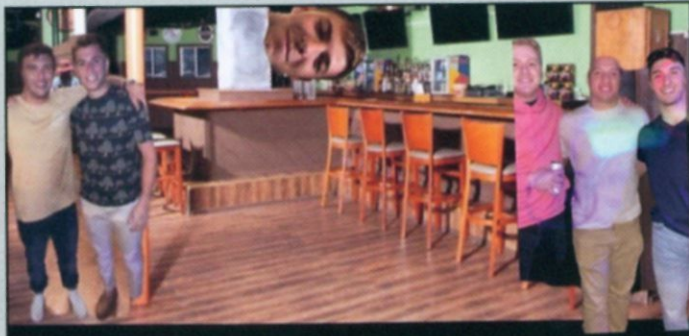
